A science fair project will not be required this year as a part of the science curriculum. It is an optional project.

Anyone who chooses to do a science fair project will need to bring their projects completely done on MONDAY February 12th. Depending on the number of projects, they will either be displayed in the bus vestibule, or in the gym. The top projects will be chosen to go on to the district fair (on Thursday, March 1st). The school, will not, however, send on a project that fails to use the scientific method.

All work will be required to be done at home, as it is an optional project, but Mrs. Paynter and Mrs. Bair welcome any questions, and are willing to help in any way they can. Please read the following information regarding rules and safety.

### **Science Fair Safety**

Please review the safety rules and display rules with your student before beginning your project!!! It is not worth someone getting hurt, or disqualified at the district fair for a rules or safety violation. Encourage your students to use photos on their display boards rather than the materials used, and their experimental results. A journal of the scientific process will also be a part of the judging process.
